The Writing and Collecting of the Psalms (Ps. 78 'the next generation ... children yet unborn ...)

Psalms-Israel/s hymn book: ('Thy word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path...)

CI: The songs in Israel's hymn book came from her walk with God through the centuries. Aim: To describe the process by which Israel's hymn book was written.

- ?? What was Israel's history like when they were focused on worshipping and praising God as he had prescribed in his word? What happened when they turned from worshipping him??
- I. <u>Hands</u>: Daily reading/meditation--> 5 Psalms / day and one chapter from Proverbs
 * Psalms 1-41 God is primarily Yahweh LORD; Ps. 42-83 God = Elohim GOD.
- II. <u>Head:</u> The songs were written in response to the historical events in Hebrew history. The books of <u>history</u> tell us <u>what God's people did</u>. The books of <u>poetry</u> tell <u>how they felt!</u>

Summary of Later Hebrew History:

United Kingdom (Saul, David, Solomon)

Divided Kingdom (931-721- (20 kings in Judah until captivity)

Judah Alone (721-586- (Jerusalem captured three times 606, 598, 587/6)

Babylonian Captivity (606-536- Babylon falls to Medes/Persians)

some of the Exiles Return (537-400 rebuild temple / walls of Jer.)

* 75 of Israel's psalms are attributed to David

* As God's people struggled through the next 6 centuries, psalms, prayers and songs continued to be written which reflected their circumstances and walk with God in their generation.

Summary of the Five Books of the Psalms (songs are sung more frequently than indiv. books are read)

I. 1-41 38 of these 41 psalms are composed by **David**

II. 42-72 **Sons of Korah** (42, 43, 44, 45, 46, 47, 48, 49)

(David=18 in book #2.... 56 of 75 psalms by David are in books 1 and 2!)

III. 73-89 Sons of Asaph (50, 73, *74, 75, 76, 77, 78, *79, 80, 81, 82, 83- *fall of Jerusalem)

IV. 90-106 Moses = Ps. 90 (6 of 7 references to Moses in the Psalms are in book #4!)

V. 107-150 The largest group of collections in the book

- * the Hallel (during Passover activities) 113-118
- * the songs of ascent (pilgrims going up to worship in Jerusalem?) 120-134

- 5) If Christ does not return for another 600 years, will there be anyone in your family (physically or spiritually) who are still faithfully worshipping and praising God?
- ** One of the central tasks of parents and grandparents in the OT is the responsibility to teach the next generations about God. <u>Each generation either learns the teaching of God and lives faithfully or they become like the nations around them</u>. This was a never ending challenge.

* Gen. 9:12 the covenant I will make for all future generations; 17:4-7 you & your descendants

* Gen 18:17-19 ... chosen Abraham that he may charge his children and his household after him to keep the way of the Lord ... that the Lord may bring to Abr. what he has promised him.

* Deut. 4:9 make them known to your children and your children's children

- * Deut. 6:6-8 ... you shall <u>teach them diligently to your children</u> .. talk, walk, lie down and rise; bind them; write them Deut. 7:9; Deut. 11:18-21 Deut. 32:7-9

- 1. <u>Be faithful all your life</u>. You may teach more to coming generations about your faith by how you "finish" than any other single item (*These all died in faith* ... Heb. 11:13).
- 2. It is important to ask if our children will have faith. (Something to pray about continually!) We should also *ask will our faith have children?* (W. Brueggemann, <u>Hope Within Hist.</u>, 92)
- 3. Have you ever known anyone to "fall away from the Lord," who was worshipping faithfully?
- 4. Worship was not a "spectator sport" for this family! (They were not inoculated against faith.)
- 5. The principle of <u>teaching the next generation and those "yet unborn"</u> is taught in the Psalms. 78. <u>Asaph's family practiced these teachings for six hundred years!</u>
- 6. Paul describes God as the Father from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named (Eph. 3:14-15). Let's pray that our children and children's children will grow up in a physical and a spiritual "forever family."
- 7. L.O. Sanderson was asked, "What is your favorite verse in our hymn book? "That one is easy:
