There is no record of Paul either finding or meeting him even in the book of _____, where, by the way, Titus is _____ mentioned. Regardless, Titus has the distinction of being named by Paul his "true _____ in the common faith", Titus 1:4 The _____ mention of this brother (as our New Testaments are arranged) is in 2nd Corinthians 2:12-13 where Paul expresses disappointment over not finding Titus in . As later expressed in the same letter Titus apparently served as a liaison between the _____ in Corinth & Paul and seemed to have had a very good relationship with them as is evidenced from 2nd Corinthians 8:16-17 where it is written that God put an _____ in Titus' heart for that congregation. In fact, the 2nd letter to the Corinthians was _____ to them by Titus as well as another unnamed brother. Paul also writes of Titus in the letter to the Galatians (2:1-3) saying that Titus accompanied him along with _____ when he went to _____. It is here that we also learn that Titus was a _____ and that regardless of a controversy at that time he was not compelled to be _____. So it seems that Titus may have served as a key figure in the early church's breaking free from those who would have burdened it with keeping tenets of _____. Titus is mentioned one more time in the 2nd letter to Timothy in 4:10 where Paul simply reports that he has gone to _____ which is present day _____ Based on these texts and the content of the letter to Titus itself, this brother must have proven himself a _____ and ___ minister of the gospel. How else would an apostle of Jesus have been confident in laying upon him the of which we read in that letter? Estimates for the date of the writing range mostly between 57AD and the mid 60s. Though Paul refers to himself as a "_____ of God" what he reveals in 3:12 certainly sounds like he is making plans like a free man. And so with this knowledge of our honored brother, let's begin our study of the letter that

was written to him over 1,900 years ago.
